Third: Course Description

This is a practical study of research techniques in preparation for thesis writing. Students are trained in essential concepts of research: problem identification, literature review, constructing a research outline/ framework and formulating objectives, thesis statement, research methods and their application to research (library, observational, experimental). The students will also learn how to prepare a research proposal, collect data and analyse it (sorting, displaying and description), the research report format, principles of scholarly writing of reports on findings, making recommendations, and documentation.
