Third: Course Description

This course provides students with the needed information and knowledge to be able to manage health services in an effective and efficient manner. The foundations of systems theory will be explored and used as a frame of reference to analyse and provide clearer understanding of health systems behaviours and phenomena. This course also introduces students to management concepts, principles and functions including planning, organizing, leading and controlling.



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Fourth: Course Objectives

Upon completion of this course, the student will be able to demonstrate the competencies expected of a nurse who has successfully completed the course of Health Services Administration, and will therefore be able to:

1. Express a comprehensive understanding of the structure, organization, and functioning of healthcare systems at local, national, and international levels.
2. Analyze health policies and regulations, including their development, implementation, and evaluation processes.
3. Demonstrate leadership and management skills necessary to effectively lead healthcare organizations, including strategic planning, human resource management, and organizational behavior.
4. Describe concepts and methods for quality improvement and patient safety initiatives within healthcare organizations, including accreditation standards and performance measurement.
5. Illustrate legal and ethical issues relevant to healthcare administration, including patient rights, privacy laws (such as HIPAA), and healthcare fraud and abuse regulations.
6. Develop communication strategies tailored to healthcare settings, including patient engagement, community relations, and branding.
7. Integrate skills in strategic planning and decision-making processes specific to healthcare environments, considering factors such as population health needs, resource allocation, and stakeholder engagement.
